7. RAGGING - AN OFFENCE

Extract of Tamil Nadu Govt. Gazette-Extra-ordinary of 29.1.97 (Bill No.8 of 1997 Tamil Nadu Prohibition of Ragging Act 1).

Ragging in any form, in any place of time is a cognizable offence that will attract severe punishment including expulsion from the College/Institution/University.

In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires, "Ragging" means display of noisy, disorderly conduct, doing any act which causes or likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear and shame or embarrassment to a student in any educational institution and includes:

- Teasing, abusing or playing practical jokes on or causing hurt to such student.
- Asking the student to do or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course willingly to act or perform.
- Ragging within or outside any education institution, shall be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to thousand rupees.
- Without prejudice to the foregoing provision, whenever, any student complains of ragging to the head of an educational institution, or to any other person responsible for the management of the educational institution, to sue the head of the educational institution inquire into the same immediately and if found true suspend the student, who has committed the offence from the educational institution.
- If reported he/she shall be summarily terminated from college for ragging.

8. TRAINING & PLACEMENT

9. LIBRARY

The College has a Computerized Central Library with more than 35520 volumes covering more than 13957 titles serving as a resource for improving knowledge of the students. The library subscribes to 57 National Journals and also has institutional membership with Anna University Library. Online Public Access Catalogue system is provided for the benefit of the users. A digital library with access to leading journals is also available.

The Central Library is quite spacious for the use of staff members and the students. They are also entitled to borrow books and journals from the Library. The college has subscribed for digital journals and resources like DELNET.

Rules and Regulations

- The Library will be opened to the students and staff from 8.30 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. on all working days.
- 2. Students could use the library and select the books of their choice.
- 3. Silence should be maintained strictly.
- 4. Students should leave their books and note books in the racks provided before they enter into the library.
- 5. On receiving a book, the student should examine the condition of the book. If there is any damage it should be brought to the notice to the Librarian. Otherwise the student will be held responsible for the damage.
- 6. A student will be allowed to keep a book for 15 days from the date of issue. It may be renewed for a period of 15 days on request.
- If the book is retained beyond the due date without renewal, a fine of Re.1/- per day will be collected up to 15 days from the due date. Thereafter Rs.2/- will be collected per day.
- 8. No reference books shall be lent.
- 9. In case of the books being lost by the student or the staff, they should replace at once with the latest editions of such books by them. When such books are not available with the publishers or sellers or out of print, double the cost of

the book will be collected from the borrowers.

- 10. Every member is expected to handle the books and magazines with utmost care.
- 11. User should not make any writing, marking, scribbling or underlining in the library books.
- 12. The librarian is authorized to send out any student who misbehaves in the library.

13. STUDENT WELFARE

Training is scheduled in every semester. The students participate with keen interest to enhance their skills and knowledge. This training is given under the guidance of qualified technical trainers from reputed Industries. The department of English also organizes BEC course for students to enhance their communication skills. People are invited from reputed concern to train students for BEC exam. Our College has membership in NPTEL & MOOCs(open online courses) for staff and students to enrich their quality and knowledge.

COUNSELING

Student counsellor is available in the campus to address the psychological and behavioral issues (or) problems of the students. Faculty members can refer the students to the counselor to render support.

Students will be divided into groups and each group will be placed under the guidance of a faculty member. BRIDGE COURSE

Before the commencement of regular classes Bridge course in Mathematics, Physics and English are conducted for the First Year students to enhance the comprehension of the subject. The refresher course will act as a buffer for the new entrants and provide adequate time for transition to Engineering courses. These courses aim at bridging school education and Engineering education.

STUDENT INDUCTION PROGRAMME

Transition from school to university/college life is one of the most challenging events in a students' life. The term induction is generally used to describe the whole process whereby the incumbents adjust to or acclimatize to their new roles and environment. In other words, it is a well-planned event to educate the new entrants about the environment in a particular institution, and connect them with the people in it. Mentoring is based on Universal Human Values such as, Truth, Righteous Conduct, Love, Non-violence and Peace. It can act as an anchor or pivot of the induction and helping in developing self-awareness, sensitivity, feel of equality, compassion and oneness. Students' attention need is to be drawn to society and nature. Helping them to reflect on their relationship with their families and peers, which is extended to the college as a family and connects the students among themselves and with their lecturers, so that they can share any difficulty at any level they might be facing and seeking the help.

14. RULES AND REGULATIONS – COLLEGE

- Students are to abide by the rules and regulations of the college. Students should attend classes regularly on all working days.
- 2. Students are not permitted to use mobile phone inside the campus.
- 3. Students should maintain minimum 75% attendance to appear the university examinations.
- 4. Strict discipline should be maintained within the premises of the institution. Indiscipline, misconduct, disobedience or any other irregularity will render a student liable for fine, suspension or immediate dismissal from the institution.

- 8. A student suspended thrice will be dismissed from the college immediately without any enquiry.
- 9. Students should pay their fees before the due date. Fees once paid will not be refunded. If any student discontinues the course in the middle of the academic year, he/she has to pay the fee as per AICTE norms.
- 10. Visitors will not be allowed to contact a student during the class hours. However, under unavoidable circumstances they will be permitted to meet the student with prior permission from the authority concerned.

CODE OF CONDUCT

- 1. Students should be punctual and regular to their classes.
- 2. Students should not loiter in the verandah or corridor during class hours.
- 3. Students should be in their class rooms at least 5 minutes before the classes commence.

- During class hours, the students should remain inside their classroom irrespective of the availability of the staff members.
- 5. Late-comers will be allowed to attend the classes only with the permission from the authority concerned.
- 6. Students will not be allowed to come out of a lecture hall during or in between two class hours without any valid reason and prior permission.
- Students are required to attend the classes with text books, note books, calculator, instrument box etc., as prescribed by the faculty members.
- 8. Students should get permission before entering the staff room or office or laboratory.
- 9. Students will be held responsible for any tool or apparatus placed in their charge and the furniture they use. In case of damage or loss, they will be held financially responsible. Any damage or breakage should be made good by the student concerned immediately when called for.
- 10. Cellular phones and other electronic gadgets are strictly prohibited inside the campus.

- 13. Students should leave the lecture hall or laboratory only with the permission of the faculty concerned and after the class is dispersed.

- 20. Notices should not be pasted on walls and no scribbling on walls.

- 21. No secret activities or meeting are permitted in the hostel premises.
- 22. Any abnormal activity of causing any disturbance to the neighborhood is strictly prohibited.
- 23. Alcohol consumption, smoking, etc. is strictly prohibited inside and outside the Campus/hostel.
- 24. Students shall not involve in any mass protest/ activity or strike or any In-disciplinary activity, otherwise they shall be removed from the hostel.
- 25. Students shall not indulge in any Ragging activity. They should be aware that Ragging is against the Law and Prohibited inside the College/Campus.
- 26. Students shall take care of all their belongings and if anything is lost, they should own the responsibility.
- 27. Students shall protect the properties of the institution and if any property of the college gets lost or damaged by students, they will own the responsibility. Furniture, electrical fitting, etc. are to be maintained by the students in good condition. In case of any damage, the individual is responsible and they will abide by the penal action instituted by college and should pay necessary fine accordingly.
- 28. In case of any Natural disaster by Accident or Act of God the college shall not be held responsible.

- 29. Students should make request/complaints only through letter to the Warden/Dy.Warden and necessary action will be initiated accordingly.
- 30. Students complaining of ill health frequently have to vacate the hostel and shall take necessary treatment outside to improve their health.
- 31. Rooms, common areas and surroundings should be kept clean and hygienic.
- 32. Students are not allowed to celebrate birthday function, any other function in the Hostel/College Campus.
- 33. Students going for outing, outside class (Gate class, software training, etc.,) and native place should get prior permission and gate pass from Deputy Warden.
- 34. Students have to leave the hostel when mess is closed for all inmates.
- 35. Students have to leave the hostel on the very next day of their last university exam in Odd semester and students have to vacate the hostel on the very next day of their last university examination in the even semester.
- 36. Students shall vacate the hostel if they indulge in any misbehavior or if they are not performing consistently well in academics.

- 37. Hostel inmates who are found guilty of misconduct or guilty of infringement of any of the rules prescribed above shall be liable to fine, bad conduct, suspension or dismissal either from the hostel or from the institute or both by the appropriate authority.
- 38. Students shall follow the above Rules and Regulations without fail and strictly adhere to the rules and regulations of the College, Mess and Hostel.

17. SYSTEM OF UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION (R 2013)

Performance in each course of study shall be evaluated based on continuous internal assessment throughout the Semester and University Examination at the end of the semester.

Each course, both theory and practical (including project work & Viva voce Examinations) shall be evaluated for a maximum of 100 marks. For all theory and practical courses including project work, the continuous internal assessment will carry 20 marks, while the End semester University Examination will carry 80 marks.

The above continuous assessment shall be awarded as per the procedure given below:

• THEORY COURSES

Three test each carry 100 marks shall be conducted during the semester by the department / college concerned. The total marks obtained in all tests put together out of 300, shall be proportionately reduced for 20 marks and rounded to the nearest integer.

• LABORATORY COURSES

The maximum marks for Internal Assessment shall be 20 in case of practical courses. Every practical exercise / experiment shall be evaluated based on conduct of experiment / exercise and records maintained. There shall be at least one test. The criteria for arriving at the internal assessment Marks of 20 is as follows: 75 marks shall be awarded for successful completion of all the prescribed experiments done in the Laboratory and 25 marks for the test. The total mark shall be reduced to 20 and rounded to the nearest integer.

18. GRADING SYSTEM (R 2013)

All assessment of a course will be done on absolute marks basis. However, for the purpose of reporting the performance of a candidate, letter grades, each carrying certain number of points, will be awarded as per the range of total marks (out of 100) obtained by the candidate in each subject as detailed below:

Grade point Average (GPA)

GPA for a semester is the ration of the sum of the products of the number of credits for courses acquired and the corresponding points to the sum of the number of credits for the courses acquired in the semester.

GPA = Sum of [Credits acquired X Grade points] / sum of Credits acquired.

Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA)

CGPA of all courses enrolled from first semester onwards "U", "I", "W" grades will be excluded for calculating GPA and CGPA.

Where Ci is the Credits assigned to the course.

GPi is the point corresponding to the grade obtained for each Course.

n is number of all courses successfully cleared during the particular semester in the case of GPA and during all the semesters in the case of CGPA.

19.SYSTEM OF UNIVERSITY EXAMINATION (R2017)

Performance in each course of study shall be evaluated based on (i) continuous internal assessment throughout the semester and (ii) University examination at the end of the semester.

Each course, both theory and practical (including project work & viva voce Examinations) shall be evaluated for a maximum of 100 marks.

For all theory and practical courses including project work, the continuous internal assessment will carry **20 marks** while the End - Semester University examination will carry **80 marks**.

Industrial training and seminar shall carry 100 marks and shall be evaluated through internal assessment only.

The University examination (theory and practical) of 3 hours duration shall ordinarily be conducted between October and December during the odd semesters and between April and June during the even semesters.

The University examination for project work shall consist of evaluation of the final report submitted by the student or students of the project group (of not exceeding 4 students) by an external examiner and an internal examiner, followed by a vivavoce examination conducted separately for each student by a committee consisting of the external examiner, the supervisor of the project group and an internal examiner. For the University examination in both theory and practical courses including project work the internal and external examiners shall be appointed by the Controller of Examinations.

PROCEDURE FOR AWARDING MARKS FOR INTERNAL ASSESSMENT

For all theory and practical courses (including project work) the continuous assessment shall be for a maximum of 20 marks. The above continuous assessment shall be awarded as per the procedure given below:

• THEORY COURSES

Three tests each carrying 100 marks shall be conducted during the semester by the Department / College concerned. The total marks obtained in all tests put together out of 300, shall be proportionately reduced for 20 marks and rounded to the nearest integer (This also implies equal weightage to all the three tests).

• LABORATORY COURSES

The maximum marks for Internal Assessment shall be 20 in case of practical courses. Every practical exercise / experiment shall be evaluated based on conduct of experiment / exercise and records maintained. There shall be at least one test. The criterion for arriving at the Internal Assessment marks of 20 is as follows: 75 marks shall be awarded for successful completion of all the prescribed experiments done in the Laboratory and 25 marks for the test. The total mark shall be reduced to 20 and rounded to the nearest integer.

20. GRADING SYSTEM (R 2017)

All assessments of a course will be evaluated on absolute marks basis. However, for the purpose of reporting the performance of a candidate, letter grades, each carrying certain number of points, will be awarded as per the range of total marks (out of 100) obtained by the candidate in each subject as detailed below:
